The CEO will succeed Dr. Charles Christiansen, current executive director who will retire in 2015. Chartered in 1965 as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, AOTF advances the science of occupational therapy to support people's full participation in meaningful life activities. The Foundation will be celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2015.

AOTF Board President Diana L. Ramsay has appointed a CEO Search Committee consisting of board members to conduct a global executive search effective immediately. "Our goal is clear – to conduct a robust and comprehensive executive search that will enable us to hire a world class CEO to lead AOTF into its next 50 years," said Ramsay.

The Chief Executive Officer is responsible for visionary leadership, building and maintaining collaborative relationships, shaping the agenda and decision-making of stakeholders, and contributing to and communicating the vision and mission of AOTF. Additionally, the Chief Executive Officer has the responsibility for mission stewardship, board relations, values and ethical standards, as well as the management of corporate identity, staff, finances, programs, accountability, and evaluation.
